appeal to me to write men

Elder J.H.N. Tindall

Dear Brother Tindall,--

I feel lonesome because I hear so little from you. I get good words in brief statements about your health and your work especially from Elders Voth and Roberts.

I have no right to request you to write me at length about those matters regarding which your efforts and mine will accomplish but little good, but, Brother Tindall, there is one very important matter which I feel that I must press upon your attention.

I need not speak of it at length because we have discussed it several times last year. I refer to the writing of a treatise on God's plan for the food of man. We greatly need a book in three or four parts dealing with this subject of God's original plan for man's diet. If I remember correctly, I have suggested to you in the past that we need to consider the matter in four parts.

1. God's plan as shown in science
2. God's plan as shown in Bible history
3. Meat-eating an emergency measure
4. Non-meat diet taught by the Testimonies.

I will now repeat to you what I have stated to you several times, that if you could write out in a simple way as though you were writing for children the subject as presented one morning when I was present at the Field Training School, that it would be of great value to our people.

In response to my repeated appeals, you have sent me a document suited to the study of lecturers. It was deep. In some things it overreached that which the ordinary reader could comprehend and believe. I sent it on to Elder D.E. Robinson when he was in Eureka, for consideration, and he has not returned it to me. I think it would be of very little value in the preparation of such a pamphlet as we need for the common people.

At the times when we have discussed this matter in the past you were loaded with work (two, three or four men's work) and you felt that you could not touch it; but now you are out working among young people, and you ought to be in a splendid mood to write such a treatise. Please consider my appeal prayerfully.
